

Den Chiefs:

Day Camp is looking for a few good Scouts who enjoy working, teaching, and being a good role model for younger Scouts. Being a den chief is a good way to get in your Leadership hours. In this role you will help the adult Den Leader with the younger Scouts for the week.

Tagalongs:

Youth Volunteers are also needed in this area. If you like working with younger children this would be the place for you. We also want a few Boy Scouts in Tagalongs to help with the "Tiger Scouts". You will be helping them work on their Bobcat and other requirements throughout the week.

BB Range:

Youth Volunteers work directly with the Cub Scouts to improve their BB shooting skills. You will be pumping the firearms for the Cub Scouts throughout the entire day. That requires some level of strength. Range assistants are also critical for being on the lookout for range safety and concerns and ensuring that the Cub Scouts use good shooting range safety practices. In addition, BB Range assistants get to shoot when we do not have Cub Scout on the range.

REQUIREMENTS:

Patience with Cub Scouts and welcoming smiles at all time. Open to Youth Volunteers **14 years and older**. All BB Range Youth Volunteers must qualify for the range before being assigned the BB Range.

Archery:

Youth Volunteers work directly with the Cub Scouts to improve their archery skills. Sometimes that entails one-on-one personalized instruction with struggling Cubs. Other times that means group instruction with the dens before or after their time on the Archery Range. Range Assistants are also critical for being on the lookout for range safety concerns and ensuring that the Cub Scouts use good archery range safety practices. In addition, Archery Range Assistants get to shoot a LOT of arrows when we don't have Cub Scouts on the range.

REQUIREMENTS:

Patience with Cub Scouts and welcoming smiles at all times. Open to Youth Volunteers **14 years and older**, younger Boy Scouts may be accepted with the permission of the Range Master. Archery Merit Badge is a good thing to have, and can be worked on during the week of Day Camp.

Whittling:

At this station you will help Cub Scouts learn the safety rules and proper use of a pocket knife. This is a very important station to the Cub Scouts, so we need your help. The station manager will show you everything you need to know about safety and how to help the Cub Scouts.

Woodburning:

Webelo II Scouts will be learning how to make designs on walking sticks using wood burning kits at this station. The Boy Scouts role at this station is to help the station manager teach these Scouts how to do this properly and safely.

Watergames:

Like playing with water? Then this may be the station for you. Help the station manager with the Cub Scouts and supplying water for all the games played throughout the week. Watch Out, You might get a little wet!!!

Fitness:

Enjoy exercising, relay races, or other fun games? Then help out at this station, you get to help younger Scouts learn the rules and how to play different field games throughout the week.

Fieldgames:

Enjoy sports like flag football, soccer or ultimate Frisbee? At this station you can help teach the Cub Scouts the rules and how to play these games and others.

Showman:

The showman station is most known for learning songs and skits. If this is something you like to do, then volunteer here. You will get to help teach the Cub Scouts new skits and songs to sing long after they leave camp.

Emergency Preparedness (EMP):

Want to show off your first aid, CPR, and other safety skills? Help out at EMP. EMP teaches the Cub Scouts many different skills they will use during and outside of Scouts. Come help the Cub learn these skills that they will use long after they leave camp.

Citizenship:

Citizenship station will teach all the young Scouts many aspects out of their Cub Scout hand books. They will learn things about our State, Our Country, and our State and Country Flag. This year the Citizenship station will have more hands on fun for the boys.

Craftsman:

At Craftsman you will help teach Cub Scouts the safety rules while using tools to build and make things. We need a few responsible Youth Volunteers that can help the station manager when Cubs Scouts are working.

Science:

This can be a great station for you if you enjoy doing cool Science projects!! If you would like to help teach the younger Scouts how to shoot rockets, make bridges, or paper airplanes this would be the place to be.

Outdoor Skills:

This is a great station for the older Scouts to volunteer at if you enjoy camping and hiking. You will help the Scouts with tents, fire building, map and compass skills, Leave No Trace, and many more fun outdoor skills.

Geocaching:

With more and more Scouts enjoying Geocaching we have made this a permanent station. If you enjoy Geocaching this is the station for you.

Geology:

The Geology station has lots of fun throughout the week. We get to crack geodes, mine for cool rocks, and learn about them while doing it. We only need a few responsible Scouts to help here at this station.

STEM:

Enjoy Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics? Then this is the station for you. Help Scouts build 3D printed hands and more.
